Sight Word: because

Sentence Accuracy & Meaning Check: *Each sentence correctly demonstrates cause-and-effect reasoning using the sight word "because."*

Fluent Reading Example: A fluent reader will read sentences with **natural rhythm**, grouping words meaningfully:

"I stayed inside / because it was raining."

"I studied hard / because I wanted a good grade."

Teacher Notes / Guide

Objective: To build **automaticity and confidence** in reading a single sight word repeatedly in **isolation** and **context**, reinforcing both recognition and comprehension.

Implementation Tips:

- Begin by introducing the word on the board and discussing its **meaning and function** (e.g., a linking word that shows *why* something happens).
- Model fluent reading aloud, emphasizing **smooth transitions** before and after the word.
- Have students echo-read each sentence, then attempt independent rereads.
- Encourage students to time themselves on Round 1 vs. Round 3 to observe improvement.

Differentiation:

- For emerging readers: Use simpler sentences or add visual icons to represent ideas (e.g., rain cloud for "raining").
- For advanced readers: Have students write their **own original sentence** using the spotlight word and share it aloud with partners.

Extension Idea: Turn the "Sight Word Spotlight" into a **daily classroom routine**. Each day a new sight word gets featured, and students record it in their **Fluency Journal** with sample sentences and a doodle for memory support.
