

## Type It Right Answer Key

1. **Simple** - One independent clause: "The dog barked loudly at the mail carrier."
2. **Compound** - Two independent clauses joined with the conjunction *for*.
3. **Complex** - Independent clause + dependent clause beginning with *when*.
4. **Compound** - Two independent clauses joined with *and*.
5. **Complex** - Dependent clause ("Because the movie was so long") + independent clause.
6. **Simple** - One independent clause: "I enjoy reading books."
7. **Compound** - Two independent clauses joined with *and*.
8. **Complex** - Dependent clause ("While he waited at the station") + independent clause.
9. **Simple** - One independent clause: "Maria baked cookies for the class."
10. **Compound** - Two independent clauses joined with *but*.

### Teacher Notes:

- **Simple sentences** contain one independent clause.
- **Compound sentences** combine two independent clauses with a coordinating conjunction (FANBOYS: for, and, nor, but, or, yet, so).
- **Complex sentences** include one independent clause and at least one dependent clause (often starting with subordinating conjunctions like *because, when, while, if, although*).
- Encourage students to underline the subject and verb in each part to help identify clauses before labeling.
