

3. Circumpolar	C. A layer of frozen seawater that builds up and moves together as a large sheet.
4. Ice shelf	D. A small shrimp-like creature that is a key food source for whales, penguins, and seals.
5. Sea ice	E. A region where colder Southern Ocean waters meet warmer northern waters.
6. Current	F. Extending or moving all the way around a pole or continent.
7. Antarctic Convergence	G. A long, shelf-shaped extension of ice that forms where a glacier reaches the ocean.
8. Iceberg	H. A powerful marine predator that lives in icy waters and hunts penguins and fish.
9. Leopard seal	I. A flowing body of water within the ocean that moves heat, nutrients, and animals.
