### Teacher's Guide

### Differentiation Tips

- Provide vocabulary support for words like climate, currents, or region.

### Engagement Ideas

- Begin with a quick prediction activity: students guess whether the Southern Ocean is the coldest, stormiest, or windiest.
- Have students stand for True and sit for False as a movement-based warm-up.

### Extension Activities

- Students write three new True or False statements for a partner to solve.
- Create a short paragraph describing why the Southern Ocean is important to the planet.
