**Jordan**: Hello, Alex. I am very glad you asked me about the new superhero movie. Movies are an excellent form of entertainment, and many people around the world enjoy them greatly.

Alex: ...Okay, but did you like it?

**Jordan**: I think movies are enjoyable because they bring happiness, joy, and fun to audiences everywhere. Movies are a positive way to connect with culture and society.

Alex: That's kind of a vague answer. Which part of the movie stood out to you? Jordan: The movie contained many exciting scenes. It was very exciting and thrilling, and the action was exciting and thrilling to watch.

**Alex**: Wow, that's... repetitive. I'll take that as a yes.

3. If Jordan were a real human, how would you expect their answers to sound different?
