

Fairy Tale Rebuilder Answer Key

Answers will vary. A strong rewrite should include:

- A **beginning** that introduces the main character or characters and sets up the fairy tale world.
- A **middle** that describes a clear problem, challenge, or major event from the fairy tale.
- An **end** that resolves the problem in a logical way that matches the original tale.
- Writing that shows the student understands how to structure a narrative from start to finish.

Teacher's Guide

- Before writing, review with students how fairy tales follow a predictable pattern: introduction, problem, resolution.
- Encourage students to **summarize**, not copy, the events of the original tale.
- Guide students to think about what makes a strong beginning, middle, and end by discussing examples from familiar stories.
- Differentiation ideas:
 - Provide picture cue cards for students who need help remembering the sequence of a chosen tale.
 - Allow advanced students to add a creative twist while keeping the structure intact.
- Engagement ideas:
 - Have students share their rewritten stories with partners and compare how differently the same tale can be retold.
- Extension ideas:
 - Ask students to rewrite a fairy tale from the point of view of a different character while keeping the structure clear.
