Directions: Each sentence below contains an **indefinite pronoun** as the subject (e.g., *everyone, each, neither, all*). Circle the correct verb form so that it agrees with the subject. Remember:

- Most indefinite pronouns (each, everyone, everybody, anyone, neither, either, somebody, nobody) are **singular**.
- Some indefinite pronouns (few, many, several, both) are **plural**.
- Some (all, some, none, most) can be singular **or** plural, depending on what they refer to.
