Teacher's Guide

- Review how to find the multiplication factor needed to reach the given denominator.
- Remind students that the numerator must be multiplied by the same number as the denominator.
- Provide fraction strips or visual models for students who need extra support.
- Have students check each other's equivalent fractions and explain their reasoning.
- Challenge early finishers to create two more fraction pairs that share a given common denominator.
- Extend the lesson by asking students which pairs would be ready for subtraction after rewriting and why.
