Teacher's Guide

- **Purpose:** This worksheet strengthens **vocabulary development** by helping students identify **synonyms**, improving their word recognition, reading fluency, and expressive writing.
- **Differentiation Tips:**
 - For **younger learners**, read each row aloud and model how to think about meanings using simple examples ("Cold and freezing both mean not warm").
 - For **older or advanced students**, ask them to explain why the third word doesn't fit.
- **Engagement Ideas:**
 - Turn it into a "**Synonym Safari**" where students walk around the room finding real-life examples of synonyms (e.g., "tiny" and "small" on posters or labels).
 - Let students act out pairs of synonym verbs (like "jump" and "hop") to bring movement to vocabulary practice.
- **Extension Activities:**
 - Have students write a short story or paragraph using at least five of the synonym pairs.
 - Challenge them to find or invent a new synonym pair for each example to expand their vocabulary range.
