- 1. The port of Boston was closed, and no goods could be traded until the colonists paid for the destroyed tea.
- 2. Britain wanted to punish the colonists for their protest and discourage further rebellion.
- 3. Merchants and dock workers lost income since no ships could come or go; the city's economy suffered.

## Teacher's Guide
