Teacher's Guide

 - Encourage students to explain how they knew each answer to promote evidence-based reasoning.

 - **Challenge:** Have advanced students write one additional riddle about a Civil Rights figure not listed.
- **Extension Ideas:**
 - Students can illustrate one riddle as a mini-poster for a "Civil Rights Heroes Gallery."
 - Pair this activity with a short video or primary source photo of each figure for visual context.
 - Have students write a short paragraph connecting one leader's courage to a modern example of activism today.
