### Teacher's Guide

- **Objective:** Reinforce understanding of key federal laws that shaped social and political equality during the Civil Rights era by connecting each law to its real-world impact.

  - **Challenge:** Ask advanced students to cite a modern example of how each law continues to affect society today.
- **Extension Ideas:**
  - Have students write a paragraph comparing one of these Civil Rights laws to a current social justice issue.
  - Create a timeline on classroom walls showing the sequence of these laws and their lasting influence.
  - Integrate civics by discussing how federal laws are enforced and what agencies ensure compliance.
