Sample Response

The Civil Rights Movement continues to shape modern justice movements by providing a model for peaceful protest and unity. Teacher's Guide

- **Objective:** Encourage critical thinking and personal reflection on the continuing influence of the Civil Rights Movement on modern justice efforts. Students connect historical themes to current social issues and develop written expression.
- **Engagement Tips:**
 - Begin with a brief discussion: "What modern movements remind you of the Civil Rights Movement? Why?"
 - Display powerful quotes from Civil Rights leaders to spark ideas before students write.
 - Encourage sharing aloud or posting anonymous responses on a classroom "Wall of Justice."
- **Differentiation:**
 - **Support:** Offer a sentence starter like, "One way the Civil Rights Movement still influences people today is..."
 - **Challenge:** Ask advanced students to include at least one modern example and explain its link to a Civil Rights tactic (e.g., boycotts, sit-ins, speeches).
- **Extension Ideas:**
 - Have students research one current organization or leader who carries forward the legacy of the Civil Rights era.
 - Assign a creative follow-up: write a modern "speech for equality" inspired by 1960s rhetoric.
 - Encourage students to identify a local issue where they could apply lessons from past movements to create positive change.
