

The Voting Rights Act is signed, protecting the right of African Americans
to vote without unfair barriers.
Rosa Parks refuses to give up her seat on a Montgomery bus, sparking a citywide boycott.
The Supreme Court rules in <i>Brown v. Board of Education</i> that segregation in public schools is unconstitutional.
Martin Luther King Jr. delivers his "I Have a Dream" speech during the March on Washington.
The Civil Rights Act is passed, banning discrimination based on race, color, religion, or gender.
The Little Rock Nine enter an all-white high school under military protection in Arkansas.
Sit-ins begin at a Greensboro lunch counter, inspiring similar protests across the South.
The Freedom Riders travel through the South to challenge segregation on interstate buses.
