Introduce Your Response Answer Key

Answers will vary. A correct topic sentence must be **clear, focused, and directly address the prompt** with a specific angle.

Sample acceptable responses:

1. A student-run snack stand can teach responsibility while giving students access to convenient food options.
2. Adding more sidewalks can make busy areas safer for pedestrians and easier to navigate.
3. The park needs a stronger cleanup plan because litter harms wildlife and makes the space less enjoyable for visitors.
4. Volunteering gives teens valuable experience that helps them build confidence and leadership skills.
5. Later school start times can improve student health by allowing them to get more sleep.

Teacher's Guide

- Review how topic sentences must **match the prompt exactly**, not drift into unrelated ideas.
- Teach students to look for the key action word in each prompt, such as **describe, explain, or identify**, to guide their sentence.
- Support struggling learners with sentence starters like **One important reason is, A major benefit is, or This matters because**.
- Encourage students to avoid vague wording and instead choose a **precise angle** that can support a strong paragraph.
- For extension, have students write a full paragraph based on their topic sentence and check whether every detail matches the idea stated in the first line.
- For peer review, ask partners to read each other's topic sentences and identify the exact prompt it responds to as a clarity check.
