

Sequence Builder Answer Key

Sample Answers (other variations acceptable if sequence words are logical):

Passage 1 - Making a Sandwich

First, I took out two slices of bread. *Next*, I spread peanut butter on one slice. *Then*, I spread jelly on the other slice. *After that*, I put the slices together. *Finally*, I cut the sandwich in half and ate it.

Passage 2 - Planting a Seed

First, I filled a small pot with soil. *Next*, I placed a seed in the soil. *Then*, I covered the seed with more soil. *After that*, I poured water into the pot. *Finally*, I put the pot in a sunny spot.

Passage 3 - Cleaning My Room

First, I picked up the clothes from the floor. *Next*, I folded them and put them in the dresser. *Then*, I organized my books on the shelf. *After that*, I vacuumed the carpet. *Finally*, I made my bed.

Passage 4 - Getting Ready for Bed

First, I brushed my teeth. *Next*, I put on my pajamas. *Then*, I read a book. *After that*, I turned off the light. *Finally*, I went to sleep.

Teacher Notes

- This worksheet emphasizes **chronological flow** and helps students see how sequence transitions organize steps clearly.
- Students may choose different sequence words (e.g., *afterward* instead of *after that*), which should still be counted correct if logical.
- Encourage them to read the passages aloud with transitions to hear how smooth the steps sound compared to the original version.
- Extension: Ask students to write their own **five-step “how-to” paragraph** (e.g., “How to play a game,” “How to bake cookies”) using at least four sequence transitions.
