

## Relationship Roles Answer Key

1. Mia's peer is Zoe, her best friend.
2. Mia's adult is her mom.
3. The authority figure is Mr. Lopez, her teacher.
4. Mia shows respect to Mr. Lopez by raising her hand, kindness to Zoe by laughing and sharing ideas, and cooperation with her mom by helping at home.
5. It is important because each type of relationship requires different communication and behavior to stay respectful and positive.

### Teacher's Guide

- **Objective:** Teach students to recognize and differentiate between peer, adult, and authority relationships through reading comprehension.
- **Differentiation Tips:**
  - For students needing support, read the story aloud and discuss each character before answering.
  - Provide **visual cue cards** labeled Peer, Adult, and Authority to help students categorize.
- **Engagement Ideas:**
  - Act out short role-plays showing how to talk to a friend, a parent, and a teacher.
  - Have students draw a picture of themselves with a peer, adult, and authority figure.
- **Extension Activities:**
  - Ask students to write a short paragraph about one person they respect and why.
  - Discuss what could happen if someone speaks to an authority figure the same way they talk to a friend.
