

## London Adventure Answer Key

Answers will vary. A complete response should:

- Mention at least one London landmark.
- Describe an activity or experience.
- Explain why the experience would be meaningful or enjoyable.

### Teacher's Guide

- Review the bolded London landmarks before students write.
- Encourage students to brainstorm ideas orally or on scratch paper.
- Provide a sample sentence starter for reluctant writers.

### Differentiation Tips

- Supply sentence frames for emerging writers such as "I would visit..." or "I would enjoy..."
- Challenge advanced writers to include sensory details like sights or sounds.
- Offer extra writing lines or typed options for students who need more space.

### Engagement Ideas

- Display pictures of the River Thames, Tower Bridge, and Big Ben.
- Play an audio clip of London street sounds to spark imagination.
- Host a quick group discussion where students share one landmark they already know.

### Extension Activities

- Invite students to draw their imagined London scene and label the landmarks.
- Ask students to write a second paragraph comparing London to their own city.
- Assign a short research task where students find one fun fact about a London landmark and share it with the class.
