

UK Vs. US Climate

Directions: Read the information below, then answer the comparison questions. Use what you know about weather patterns in the United Kingdom and different regions of the United States.

The United Kingdom has a **mild maritime climate**. This means temperatures stay fairly moderate throughout the year, with cool summers and mild winters. Rain is common in all seasons because the UK is surrounded by ocean waters that help regulate temperature.

In contrast, the United States has many different climate regions.

- The Northeast has cold, snowy winters and warm summers.
- The **Southeast** is known for hot, humid summers and mild winters.
- The Southwest experiences dry air and high temperatures, especially in desert areas.
- The Pacific Northwest gets heavy rainfall but stays cooler than most of the country.
- The Midwest has hot summers and very cold winters with strong seasonal changes.
