### Teacher's Guide

- Review the idea of states and capitals before beginning.
- Encourage students to use memory tricks, such as repeating the pair aloud.
- Allow partners to check each other's answers after completing the list.

### Differentiation Tips

- Provide a labeled U.S. map for students who need reference support.
- For students needing more challenge, have them write one fact about each capital city after matching.
- Offer verbal clues for struggling readers, such as starting letter hints.

### Engagement Ideas

- Run a quick class game where you call out a state and students try to shout the capital first.
- Invite students to create a small drawing that represents one state and its capital.

### Extension Activities

- Have students pick one state and research why its capital was chosen.
- Ask students to create their own matching list with five new states and capitals to trade with a classmate.
