Who's Talking Now Answer Key

Corrected Dialogue

Liam: Hey, guess **whom** I saw at the library yesterday?

Ava: No clue. **Whom** did you talk to? → (To **whom** did you talk?)

Liam: I talked to the new student **whom** everyone keeps whispering about.

Ava: Oh, the one **whom** you said was from another country?

Liam: Yeah! I couldn't remember **whom** the teacher introduced her to. → (To **whom** the teacher introduced her.)

Ava: To **whom** did she give that science book?

Liam: Not sure. She asked **who** should help her carry her bag.

Ava: Maybe she'll tell you **whom** she's working with on the project.

Liam: If only I knew **whom** she trusted enough to partner with.

Teacher's Guide

- **Skill Focus:** Strengthens understanding of *who* (subject pronoun) and *whom* (object pronoun) through real-world dialogue correction and formal language rewriting.
- **Differentiation Tips:**
 - For students who need extra guidance, provide a mini review: *who* = *he/she*, *whom* = *him/her*.
 - For advanced learners, challenge them to explain how prepositions affect pronoun choice in their rewrites.
- **Engagement Idea:** Pair students to perform both the **casual** and **formal** versions aloud, emphasizing how formality changes tone.
- **Extension Activity:** Ask students to write their own short dialogue (4-6 lines) where *who* and *whom* are used correctly in both informal and formal contexts.
