## **Making AI Smarter with Better Prompts**

**Introduction -** Al models give answers based on the words people type in - this is called a **prompt**. If the prompt is vague or confusing, the Al may give the wrong answer. Humans can usually guess what someone "meant," but Al can't. Instead, it only works with what's written.

That means: Clearer prompts  $\rightarrow$  Better answers.

Read the original prompt and the AI's mistaken answer. Spot why the answer might be wrong. Rewrite the original prompt in a clearer way that would help the AI give a better response.

**Example - Original Prompt:** "Tell me about Mercury."

Al Output: "Mercury is a silvery liquid metal used in thermometers."

**Problem:** The AI answered about Mercury the element, not Mercury the planet.

Rewrite Prompt: "Tell me about Mercury, the planet in our solar system."

Case 1 - Original Prompt: "Write about a jaguar."

Al Output: "The Jaguar is a popular car in Europe."



Case 2 - Original Prompt: "Who is the president?"

Al Output: "The president is Barack Obama."
