### Teacher's Guide

- **Purpose:** This worksheet helps students build and apply **key World War I vocabulary** to strengthen both historical understanding and contextual reading skills.
- **Differentiation Tips:**
  - For younger or struggling learners, read the sentences aloud and provide definitions for each word before students complete the blanks.
  - For advanced students, ask them to **write a new sentence** using each term to show understanding.
  - Provide hints for trickier terms, such as "This word means 'a peace agreement'."
- **Engagement Ideas:**
  - Turn it into a **"Word Battle"** game where students earn points for correctly filling in blanks without using the word bank.
  - Have students illustrate one of the sentences, such as life in a trench or soldiers signing the armistice.
- **Extension Activities:**
  - Ask students to create a short paragraph describing a day in the life of a World War I soldier using at least five of the vocabulary words.
  - Pair this worksheet with a map activity showing which countries formed alliances during the war.
