Teacher's Guide

- **Purpose:** This worksheet reinforces knowledge of **major political leaders during World War I**, helping students connect names, nations, and historical roles.
- **Differentiation Tips:**
 - For younger or struggling readers, provide **brief biographical hints** or portraits of each leader.
 - For advanced learners, ask students to **research one leader's key decision** during the war and summarize it in one sentence.
 - Use repetition to reinforce pronunciation of titles such as "Kaiser," "Czar," and "Sultan."
- **Engagement Ideas:**
 - Play a **"Who Am I?" guessing game**, where students read clues and others guess the leader.
 - Have students draw flags or symbols for each nation to visually connect leaders to their countries.
- **Extension Activities:**
 - Create a timeline showing when each leader came to power and what happened to their rule after the war.
 - Compare leadership styles-ask students how democracy, monarchy, and empire affected decisions made during the conflict.
