During World War II, the Holocaust was a period of horrific persecution led by Nazi Germany. Millions of Jewish people, along with others such as Roma, disabled individuals, and political prisoners, were imprisoned and killed in concentration camps. Ordinary citizens were often witnesses to these injustices, while others risked their lives to help victims escape. After the war, the world came together to ensure such atrocities would never happen again, forming the Universal Declaration of Human Rights in 1948 as a promise to protect all people's dignity and freedom.

2. What lessons about human rights can be learned from this tragic event?

3. How did some individuals show courage during this time?

4. What can you, as a student today, do to stand up for fairness and justice in your community?
