## Shadows Of Humanity Answer Key

1. Targeted groups included Jewish people, Roma, disabled individuals, and political prisoners; remembering them honors victims and prevents forgetting the past.

3. Individuals showed courage by hiding victims, speaking out, and resisting oppressive laws.

### Teacher's Guide

- **Differentiation Tips:**
  - Preview sensitive vocabulary (e.g., *persecution*, *human rights*) and discuss definitions.
  - For visual learners, provide a timeline or map of Europe during WWII to help contextualize the events.
  - For advanced learners, invite written responses connecting the Holocaust to modern examples of human rights issues.
- **Engagement Ideas:**
  - Conduct a short classroom discussion about what "never again" means and why it matters.
  - Have students write a short journal entry imagining they were a witness who chose to help.
- **Extension Ideas:**
  - Introduce excerpts from the Universal Declaration of Human Rights and let students identify rights that protect against persecution.
  - Encourage students to research one "Righteous Among the Nations" individual who helped save lives and present their story to the class.
