

## Neutral or Personal Answer Key

1. Objective - Neutral description with no opinions or feelings.
2. Subjective - Words like felt, worried, nervous hands show emotional interpretation.
3. Objective - Factual events and specific times only.
4. Objective - Describes only actions without judgement.
5. Subjective - Words like too early, dragging, tired faces, doomed show emotional commentary.

### Teacher's Guide

- Review the difference between **objective narration** (fact based, neutral, detached) and **subjective narration** (emotion based, opinion filled).
- Encourage students to underline **emotion words**, **judgment words**, or **opinion phrases** to identify subjectivity.
- For differentiation, provide a word bank of neutral words and emotional words to help students sort passages accurately.
- Discuss how point of view affects tone. Ask students how each passage would feel if rewritten the opposite way.
- For engagement, let students write a short objective version and a subjective version of the same everyday event.
- Extension idea: Ask students to pick their favorite passage and rewrite it in a different grammatical point of view (first, second, or third person) while keeping the level of subjectivity the same.
