Prompt One: Second person

Reason: Creates urgency and direct involvement, making the reader feel

responsible for escaping.

Prompt Two: Third person

Reason: Allows balanced access to both siblings' actions and reactions without

bias.

Prompt Three: Third person limited

Reason: Keeps the detective's hidden doubts secret while still following the

investigation closely.

Prompt Four: First person

Reason: Captures personal impressions, awe, and sensory details unique to the

traveler.

Teacher's Guide

- Emphasize how **POV supports narrative purpose**. Choosing the right POV shapes mood, access to thoughts, and the reader's connection to characters.
- Use quick mini-lessons to review strengths of each POV:
 - First person brings intimacy and emotion.
 - Second person creates immediacy and reader involvement.
 - Third person offers flexibility and broader scope.
- For differentiation, provide a chart with keywords: **internal thoughts**, **distance**, **bias**, **scope**, **reader involvement**.
- Encourage students to justify their choices with specific narrative goals, not general preferences.
- For engagement, allow students to rewrite one prompt in two different POVs to compare how the tone changes.
