Because this is an observation activity, student answers will vary. However, accurate responses should include:

- At least five **specific details** about the classroom scene.
- Descriptive sentences that match details shown in the picture.
- Sentences that make sense, start with capital letters, and end with correct punctuation.

Teacher's Guide

Purpose: To build early observational skills and help students turn visual details into clear descriptive sentences.

Teaching Tips:

- Model one example by looking at the picture together and naming a **specific detail**, such as a color, action, or object.
- Encourage students to use **complete sentences** and to reread their work for punctuation and clarity.

Differentiation:

- For advanced students, challenge them to use two details in one sentence or include a **strong describing word** like bright or messy.
- Allow verbal brainstorming before writing for students who struggle with generating ideas.

Extension Ideas:

- Have students draw their own classroom scene and trade with a partner to describe.
- Ask students to write one sentence about how the classroom might feel if they were in it.
- Invite students to compare two different classroom pictures and describe how they differ.
